KEYTRUDA is a prescription medicine used to treat: a kind of skin cancer called melanoma. It may be used when your melanoma has spread or cannot be removed by surgery (advanced melanoma), or; It may be used to help prevent melanoma from coming back after it and lymph nodes that contain cancer have been removed by surgery.

Pembrolizumab (Keytruda®) Adjuvant Therapy Even after successfully removing melanoma through surgery, patients may be at risk for melanoma coming back. Pembrolizumab (Keytruda) in the adjuvant setting reduces this risk by stimulating the body's immune system to fight any remaining cancer cells.

Keytruda (pembrolizumab) is a cancer medicine that interferes with the growth and spread of cancer cells in the body. Keytruda is used alone or in combination with other medicines to treat certain types of cancer such as: advanced skin cancer (melanoma or Merkel cell carcinoma);

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved Keytruda in 2014 to treat patients with advanced or unresectable melanoma who are no longer responding to other drugs. Then in 2015, based on results of a pivotal Phase 3 trial, the FDA decided to expand Keytruda to be a first-line treatment of patients with advanced melanoma.

Systemic treatments are drugs that reach all parts of your body through the bloodstream. Such drugs fight cancer cells that have metastasized, or spread, from the original tumor to other areas.

Keytruda is the second "checkpoint inhibitor" demonstrated to improve the treatment of stage III melanoma. The United States Food and Drug Administration also granted approval to Opdivo (nivolumab) for the adjuvant treatment of melanoma.
